#### **SUMARY**

We will present case studies of NGO-university partnerships in the Brazilian Amazon. From 2009-2014, UF's Amazon Conservation Leadership Initiative presented a series of field courses for conservation professionals on social-ecological resilience and multi-stakeholder dialogue. During 2015-2017, two of the participating NGOs developed and implemented training programs with community leaders that applied tools and strategies from the ACLI courses. Instituto Centro de Vida developed a 3-module training program for community leaders from 7 municipalities in northern Mato Grosso. Idesam provided a 1-week course for community leaders in Apuí, southern Amazonas. We will briefly present these experiences and then lead an open discussion about how to build on them to effectively strengthen governance and resilience.

Bob Buschbacher is director of the Amazon Conservation Leadership Initiative. Prior to coming to UF in 2001, he was technical director of WWF-Brazil and led the WWF-US Tropical Forestry Program.
