Summary

Efforts to integrate gender into political ecology and degrowth theory and practice have brought me into dialogue with diverse interlocutors. I have learned continually through thirty years of intermittent field research with Andean and Amazonian communities, via collaborative writing and editing, and while delivering fifty keynote and invited lectures around the world. Commitment to public engagement has spurred my participation in indigenous leader workshops, [executive summits](#), [radio](#), [television](#), and news outlets ranging from [The Economist](#) to [Degrowth.info](#). I find hope and motivation with students in courses I teach on *Climate Change and Environmental Justice* and *Gender, Masculinities & Environment*; in advising thesis projects at the University of Florida and other universities in several countries; and in publishing with young scholars from Latin America and beyond.
